School and Community Events

- **Marketing Innovation Challenge**

The Marketing Innovation Challenge is organised by Republic Polytechnic, aiming to promote consumer insights as the basis for strategic business thinking and design creativity among secondary school students. Our students will be participating in the competition this year.

2.3 Sec 3 Express Extended Curriculum

The Sec 3 Express Extended Curriculum will take place from 31 Oct to 11 Nov 2016. The objective of the extended lessons is to better prepare students for their national examinations in 2017.

Attendance is **compulsory** and students have to report at 7.25am for morning assembly.

Students must be in full school uniform with proper shoes. Improperly attired students will be asked to go home to change into their full school uniform with proper shoes before they are allowed back in school for lessons. The schedule of the extended curriculum is attached in **Annex A**.

2.4 Sec 2 Express and Normal Academic Science Assignment

The Sec 2 Express and Normal Academic Science students are required to complete 100 multiple choice questions which cover Sec 1 and 2 science concepts. The objective of the multiple choice questions is to get students to revise and better prepare them for the rigour of the Sec 2 End-of-Year Science Examination which encompasses two years of Science content.

Students can access the questions from the MC Online portal by logging in with their username and password. Students are expected to complete the multiple choice questions by 12th September 2016 and completion of the assignment is **compulsory**.

2.5 Sec 4 Normal Academic and Normal Technical Learning Journey to ITE College Central

To better equip this group of students on what is in store for them in their post-secondary education, a compulsory learning journey to ITE College Central has been arranged on the following date and time. The students will get to know first-hand, in-depth and direct information, from the lecturers and administrators, on Direct-entry to Polytechnic Programme (DPP), ITE courses and progression paths as well as Apprenticeship Programme; where students can study and earn a monthly pay at the same time. There will also be a campus tour after the briefing.

4.1 Holistic Health Education

Holistic Health Education Bulletin 3

Help Your Child Manage Stress

Stress can affect a child's physical, emotional, social and intellectual well-being. It is critical to help your child manage stress during the examinations period. Stress is inevitable, even for children, whether it arises from their relationship with their parents, teachers and friends, or from school. Instead of protecting them from possible sources of stress, you can help your child face his problems with your love and support, and by teaching him the necessary skills to deal with them.

Possible signs that your child is facing stress:

- A happy child who suddenly becomes sad
- A child who has always enjoyed going to school now hates it

Tips to Help Your Child Manage Stress

1. Sufficient sleep, rest and relaxation

Make sure your child gets enough sleep every night. Maintain a regular bedtime and give your child time during the day to do the things he likes. Let your child do something enjoyable to take his mind off his problems. It may be playing outdoors with his friends or listening to music. You can also teach him to relax by getting him to close his eyes and think of happy thoughts like a day by the beach or playing with his good friends.

2. Be a positive role model and handling criticism

Children learn by watching their parents. If your child sees you using appropriate coping skills when you are under stress, he will learn from you. Show him that stress is normal and can be handled in a calm and effective manner, e.g. going for a jog. Criticism can take the form of teasing from friends or comments from teachers and parents. Let your child know that no one is perfect and that we all make mistakes which we can learn from. You can use role play to teach your child how to handle teasing and unfair criticism.

3. Provide a routine and problem solving skills

Children need predictability in their lives. Having a routine for meal times, homework, bed time and play time allows your child to know what to expect. This, in turn, helps him become more disciplined and feel less

stressed. Help your child define the exact problem. Let your child come up with possible solutions, then go through each possibility and evaluate its potential for success. Once all the solutions have been evaluated, let him decide which the best solution is. Over time, your child will develop good problem-solving skills.

Lastly, being able to handle stress not only will make your child a happier person but will lead to a more positive outlook towards things in life.

5.1 Extension of Concessionary Travel for all Sec 4s & Sec 5s

Please note that the concessionary travel for all Sec 4E/NT & Sec 5NA students who are taking the GCE "O" Level examinations in 2016 and all Sec 4NA proceeding to Sec 5NA in 2017 will expire on 31 Dec 2016.

Sec 4 (Express and Normal Technical) & Sec 5 (Normal Academic)

Students are advised to present their School Smart Card (SSC) at any Transit Link (TL) Ticket Office, Concession Card Replacement Office (CCRO), Passenger Service Centre (PSC), Add Value Machine (AVM) or the General Ticketing Machine (GTM) to extend the concession validity of their SSCs to continue enjoying concessionary travel till **31 Jan 2017**.

Sec 4 (Normal Academic)

As the concessionary travel for all Sec 4NA students proceeding to Sec 5NA in 2017 will also expire on 31 Dec 2016, students are advised to present their School Smart Card (SSC) at any Transit Link (TL) Ticket Office, Concession Card Replacement Office (CCRO), Passenger Service Centre (PSC), Add Value Machine (AVM) or the General Ticketing Machine (GTM) to extend the concession validity of their SSCs till **31 Dec 2017**.

All students can start to activate the extension **with immediate effect** and the last day for extension of concessionary travel is **18 Sep 2016**. They should call TL-Hotline at 1800-2255 663 for assistance if they encounter problem extending the concession validity. TL's Hotline Operating hours are from 8am - 6pm daily and they are closed on Public Holidays.

Students who are paying their fare charges through GIRO or Auto Credit Card are also required to extend the concession validity of their SSCs at any of the machines/offices mentioned above.

5.4 Safety Updates

Health Advisory on Localised Community Spread of Zika Virus Infection

On 28 Aug 2016, MOH has confirmed 41 cases of locally transmitted Zika virus infection in Singapore. 34 have fully recovered. The other 7, who are still symptomatic and potentially infectious, are recovering at Tan Tock Seng Hospital.

Zika is generally a mild disease and some people infected with the Zika virus do not even develop symptoms. Like dengue, it is not spread from person to person, but is transmitted by the bite of an infected *Aedes* mosquito.

To minimise the risk of further spread of Zika in Singapore, it is critical that all of us as a community, take immediate steps to prevent mosquito breeding in schools as well as our homes by doing the 5-step Mozzie Wipeout as follows:

- Change water in vases/bowls on alternate days
- Turn over all water storage containers
- Remove water from flower pot plates on alternate days
- Cover bamboo pole holders when not in use
- Clear blockages and put Bti insecticide in roof gutters monthly

Rapid changes in technology, shorter life-cycles before a product is obsolete, changes in media (tapes, software, MP3) and falling prices have resulted in a fast-growing surplus of electronic waste around the globe.

In 2012, StarHub initiated a massive consumer-oriented environmental programme, to provide consumers with avenues to responsibly dispose of their e-waste. They partnered with home-grown e-waste recycler TES-AMM to launch the StarHub E-Waste Recycling Programme on 31 March 2012, during Earth Hour.

Unity has also joined the nation in its effort to recycle E-waste in July 2016. The bin is now located at **our school canteen**. We strongly encourage all staff, parents and students to make use of this service to dispose your e-waste responsibly.



Here are some items you can recycle in the RENEW bins: answering machines, cables, car stereos, computer mice, CDs/ DVDs, docking stations, CD/ DVD/ VCD players, electronic toys, hard drives,

keyboards, laptops, lithium-ion (Li-on) batteries, mobile phones, modems, MP3 players, printed circuit boards, printers, remote controls, routers, set-top boxes, telephones, VCRs and wires. However, all recycled items must be able to fit through the bin's **470mm x 120mm slot**.
