3.1 Character and Leadership Development (CLD)

3.1.1 Unity Students' Values-In-Action (VIA) Programme

At the end of each VIA programme, students will reflect on their learning in their individual reflection log on how they have led themselves and served others through the programmes. This helps them to internalise the values they have learnt.

On top of the VIA programmes listed above, students also organise Student-Initiated VIA activities to put their values and leadership skills into action. The Sec 2 students will be involved in organising a Fun Fair to raise funds for the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) as part of the End-Year Leadership Learning Week programmes.

3.1.2 Character and Leadership Development (CLD) Assessment

As shared in the first issue of the newsletter, our school adopts a whole-school approach to develop every student as a committed leader guided by sound values and effective life skills. This is done through the weekly Character and Leadership Education (CLE) lessons as well as the various experiential learning platforms in the areas of Values-In-Action (VIA), National Education (NE), Aesthetics Education Programme (AEP),⁸

Environment Education Programme (EEP), Education and Career Guidance (ECG) and Co-Curricular Activities (CCA).

In line with the emphasis on the Character and Leadership Development (CLD) of our students, the CLD Assessment is implemented annually to provide students with a holistic overview of their character and leadership development. It also serves to affirm, recognise and motivate students in their leadership learning.

The CLD assessment comprises two key areas: Character and Leadership Education (CLE) and Co-Curricular Activities (CCA). A set of rubrics has been developed to assess the extent to which our students demonstrate the school values, leadership competencies and citizenship in the classroom as well as through their co-curricular activities. There are three levels of assessment: Teacher-Assessment (2 Form Teachers (FTs) and 1 CCA teacher), Self-Assessment (the student himself / herself) and Peer-Assessment (an assigned peer who knows the student).

The CLD assessment will be conducted in Term 3 and the results will be consolidated and captured in the CLD Report, which will be issued together with the Progress Report in Term 3 Week 10 by the FTs. This CLD Report is to be kept in students' report books as a point of reference for their holistic development reporting.

We believe that assessment is an integral part of the holistic development of students and it will motivate them to demonstrate positive values, leadership competencies and citizenship in their day-to-day activities. We look forward to your partnership in nurturing our students to be committed leaders guided by sound values and effective life skills.

Strategic Thrust 4: High Care, Strong Discipline, Actualising Potential

Through high level of care from the school, our students exude strong discipline and are able to realise their potential

4.1 Discipline and Code of Conduct

Our Strategic Thrust 4, High Care, Strong Discipline, Actualising Potential, guides us in cultivating student holistic development through high level of care and discipline in the school, so that all students carry themselves with self-discipline and personal pride.

In this regard, the school emphasises much on decorum which is an important indicator of students' self-discipline and personal pride. We believe in working closely with parents to monitor the students' decorum. The Discipline Committee has issued a Notification Letter at the beginning of the year to all parents to keep parents informed of the Decorum Checks. The Discipline Committee will be conducting Decorum Checks regularly during morning assemblies.

To ensure that our students are focused in their learning to actualise potential, the use of electronic devices should primarily serve as tools of communication in times of emergency and not serve as distractions. Students are not to use their mobile phones in any venues deployed for teaching and learning. These venues include academic blocks, all classrooms, laboratories, library, special rooms, school hall etc. The use of electronic devices is not allowed during official school activities, including change in lesson periods, unless sanctioned by the teacher-in-charge. Students who infringe rules on the usage of mobile phones and other personal electronic gadgets may have their devices confiscated. 4.2 Holistic Health Education

Influenza

Influenza, also known as the flu, is an infection caused by Influenza viruses. Despite being commonly confused with the common cold which is caused by other respiratory viruses, influenza is usually more severe.

Definition & Characteristics

There are three main types of viruses responsible for Influenza infections – Type A, Type B and Type C. Influenza A and B are associated with annual outbreaks and epidemics. Influenza C is associated with mild sporadic illness and occurs less frequently than Influenza A and B.

How Influenza Spreads

Influenza is spread from person to person through respiratory droplets propelled by coughing and sneezing. Influenza can also be passed on through contact with contaminated surfaces, for example touching an object like a doorknob or telephone receiver that has been recently handled by someone who is infected with Influenza and then touching the nose or mouth. Adults may be contagious from one day before the onset of symptoms till 5 to 7 days after onset. Children and persons with weakened immune systems may be infectious for longer periods of time.

Symptoms

Influenza is characterised by a sudden onset of symptoms such as:
Fever, Headache, Chills, Cough, Sore throat, Muscle aches, General malaise and fatigue

Gastrointestinal symptoms, such as nausea, vomiting or diarrhoea, can sometimes accompany Influenza, especially in children, but these symptoms are rarely prominent.

What to Do If You Have Influenza

If you suspect you have an Influenza infection, you should stay home and avoid contact with other people except to seek medical care. You should also avoid strenuous physical activity such as jogging and running during the illness until complete recovery. Most people with Influenza have mild illness and do not require medical care or antiviral drugs. If you are concerned about your illness, please consult your doctor. However, people at higher risk of developing complications of Influenza should consult their doctor on the need to be examined if they get Influenza-like symptoms.

Seek immediate medical attention if you experience the following warning signs:

Treatment of Influenza

Antiviral medications are currently available for the treatment of Influenza. They can help reduce the severity of symptoms and promote recovery. To be effective, antivirals should be taken within the first two days of illness. Antivirals can be classified into:

- adamantanes (eg amantadine and remantadine) and
- neuraminidase inhibitors (eg oseltamivir and zanamivir)

Precautions You Can Take

- Annual Influenza vaccination is recommended to protect against Influenza, especially for individuals belonging to populations at higher risk of complications of Influenza.
- People living and caring for high-risk individuals should also be vaccinated against Influenza.
- Practising good personal hygiene to prevent the spread of Influenza. Wash your hands regularly and thoroughly with soap and water, especially before touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Turning quickly away from anyone and cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing and sneezing. Avoiding crowded places if you are unwell.
- Staying home from work or school when you are sick.
- Using a serving spoon when sharing food at meal times.

5.2 Temperature Taking Exercise

The Temperature Taking Exercise is conducted twice a year and aims to maintain school's preparedness to re-activate the temperature-taking regime should there be a need to. It also serves to educate staff and students to take personal responsibility for their own health and practise social responsibility.

Please note that the second temperature-taking exercise of 2017 will be conducted on **Friday, 30 June 2017**. Please ensure that your child has a working thermometer during the exercise.

5.3 15 Year Old NRIC Registration at School

The ICA's mobile registration team will be visiting the school on **Monday, 10 July 2017** to conduct the NRIC Registration for 15 year-old students.

ICA will be sending notification letters to the affected students through the parents two weeks before the appointment date. Do remind your child to bring along the required documents as stated in the notification letter on the day of the registration. Your child will receive his/her NRIC on **Friday, 15 September 2017** from the Form Teachers during the CLE lesson.

5.4 School Health Services

The Annual Health Screening Exercise will be held from **24 July – 2 August 2017**. It will involve the Sec 1 to Sec 4 students. More information will be made known to the students nearer to the date.

5.5 Reporting of Travel History

As part of emergency preparedness, all students with the intention to travel overseas during the June holidays are required to declare their travel plans.

5.6 Updating of parents' contact details and commuting status

Also, if your child is commuting to school daily or weekly (eg, coming to school from Johor), please update the school promptly as this information is critical as part of our emergency preparedness.

5.7 Safety Updates

In View of the "Very Warm Temperature", How Do We Beat the Heat!!

- Wear loose-fitting, heat-permeable and light-coloured clothing
- Drink fluids to stay hydrated
- Take more breaks between activities
- Reduce outdoor activities during the hot part of the day or stay in the shade
- Plan your sport and exercise activity in the cooler hours of the day
- Watch for symptoms of heat-induced illness and seek medical attention

Protection Against Excessive Exposure to Ultraviolet (UV) Radiation

- Some UV exposure is important for health functions such as Vitamin D production in the body and treating diseases like jaundice in babies.
- Excessive exposure to solar UV radiation can result in harmful effects to the skin and eyes. If you must be out in the sun, especially between 11am and 3pm when the UV index levels are highest, the following simple protective measures can help to minimise the effects:
 - Use sunscreen (at least SPF 30)
 - Use umbrella and seek shade
 - Wear sunglasses that block UV rays
 - Wear broad-brimmed hat

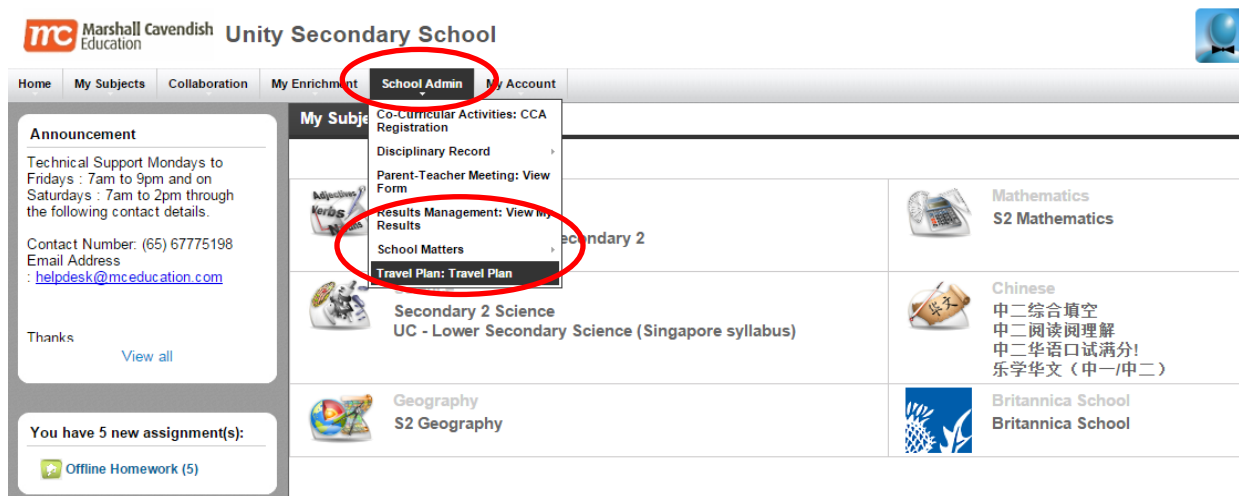

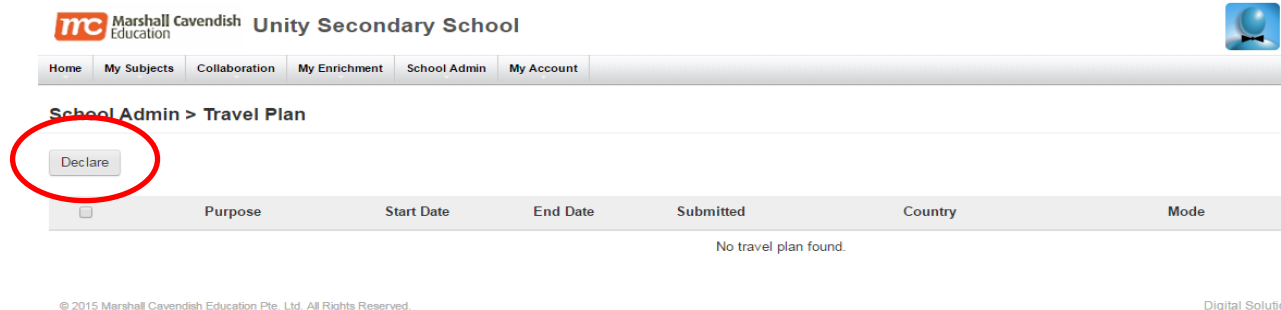
