## **3.1 Character and Leadership Development (CLD)**

### **3.1.1 Unity Students' Values-In-Action (VIA) Programme**

Our students have completed the following structured Values-In-Action (VIA) programmes:

- Sec 1: Flyer Distribution and Newspaper Collection in the Yew Tee Community for Children's Charities Association
- Sec 2: Fun Fair to help raise funds for Unitians under financial assistance
- Sec 3: Keep Singapore Clean Movement & Reaching Out to the Elderly – Project SPHERE
- Sec 4 & 5: Commemorating International Friendship Day through Service Learning Day: "Global Issues" Symposium

At the end of each VIA programme, students will reflect on their learning in their individual reflection logs on how they have led themselves and served others through the programmes. This helps them to internalise the values they have learnt.

On top of the structured VIA programmes, students also organise Student-Initiated VIA activities to put their values and leadership skills into action.

### **3.1.2 Character and Leadership Development (CLD) Assessment**

As shared in the first issue of the newsletter, our school adopts a whole-school approach to develop every student as a committed leader guided by sound values and effective life skills. This is done through the weekly Character and Leadership Education (CLE) lessons as well as the various experiential learning platforms in the areas of Values-In-Action (VIA), National Education (NE), Aesthetic Programme (AEP), Cultural Education Programme (CEP), Environment Education Programme (EEP), Education and Career Guidance (ECG) and Co-Curricular Activities (CCA).

In line with the emphasis on the Character and Leadership Development (CLD) of our students, the CLD Assessment is implemented annually to provide students with a holistic overview of their character and leadership development. It also serves to affirm, recognise and motivate students in their leadership learning.

The CLD assessment comprises two key areas: Character and Leadership Education (CLE) and Co-Curricular Activities (CCA). A set of rubrics has been developed to assess the extent to which our students demonstrate the school values, leadership competencies and citizenship in the classroom as well as through their co-curricular activities. There are three levels of assessment: Teacher-Assessment (2 Form Teachers (FTs) and 1 CCA teacher), Self-Assessment (the student himself / herself) and Peer-Assessment (an assigned peer who knows the student).

The CLD assessment will be conducted in Term 3 and the results will be consolidated and captured in the CLD Report, which will be issued together with the Progress Report in Term 3 Week 10 by the FTs. This CLD Report is to be kept in students' report books as a point of reference for their holistic development reporting.

We believe that assessment is an integral part of the holistic development of students and it will motivate them to demonstrate positive values, leadership competencies and citizenship in their day-to-day activities.

We look forward to your partnership in nurturing our students to be committed leaders guided by sound values and effective life skills.

## **Strategic Thrust 4: High Care, High Discipline, High Pride**

Through high level of care from the school, our students exude strong discipline and pride

### **4.1 Holistic Health Education**

#### **Healthy Meals in Schools and at Home**

Childhood and adolescent years are crucial to set the foundation for healthy growth. Eating a nutritionally balanced diet supports optimal growth and development. By encouraging healthy eating habits now, we can give our students the best opportunity to grow into healthy adults.

Research has shown that food preferences are generally acquired during childhood and that eating habits acquired after adolescence are more resistant to change.

The school environment plays an important role in nurturing and sustaining good eating habits. Most students consume at least one snack or one meal in their school canteen on most days of the week over a period of several years.

In view of this, the Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP) seeks to enhance the availability of healthier food and beverage choices in schools through an integrated programme involving teachers, canteen vendors and students.

Canteen vendors in schools are expected to follow food service guidelines which aim to encourage canteen vendors to cut down fat, sugar and salt and serve whole-grains, fruit and vegetables in the meals, and to serve healthy set meals. These healthy set meals incorporate food from the four main food groups – brown rice and wholemeal bread, meat and others, vegetables and fruits – thereby helping students receive the right nutrients necessary for their growing needs.

Health Promotion Board (HPB) has also developed a **Parents' Booklet** to encourage parents to nurture healthy eating habits at home. Together with the Healthy Meals in Schools Programme, we aim to promote the consumption of healthy meals with a balanced mix of the four different food groups – brown rice, whole grain noodles and wholemeal bread; fruit and vegetables as well as meat and alternatives, both in school and at home.

So remember, healthy living starts from home. Be a good role model and help your child cultivate healthy habits from young.

## 5.7 Safety Updates

### UNDERSTANDING HAZE

#### What does "PSI" mean?

PSI stands for 'Pollutant Standards Index'. It is an index developed by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to provide accurate, timely and easily understandable information about daily levels of air pollution. The figure is derived by averaging data collected for the past 24 hours.

Different PSI values indicate different air quality levels:

PSI VALUE	AIR QUALITY DESCRIPTOR
0 – 50	GOOD
51 – 100	MODERATE
101 – 200	UNHEALTHY
201 – 300	VERY UNHEALTHY
ABOVE 300	HAZARDOUS

#### What are the effects of haze on children / young adults, both indoors and outdoors?

- The haze contains pollutant gases and particulate matter that can irritate the airways, eyes and skin. This can be worse if the person has conditions such as asthma and allergic conjunctivitis
- Staying outdoors for prolonged periods can expose the person to more effects of the haze

#### What are the precautions to be taken?

- Minimise outdoor activities where possible
- When it is necessary to go outdoors, avoid exertions like running. Vigorous physical exercise can increase the air intake by 30 to 50%, which means inhaling more pollutants
- Drink plenty of water
- See a doctor if you feel unwell
- Wear a mask (N95) if prolonged outdoor activity is unavoidable

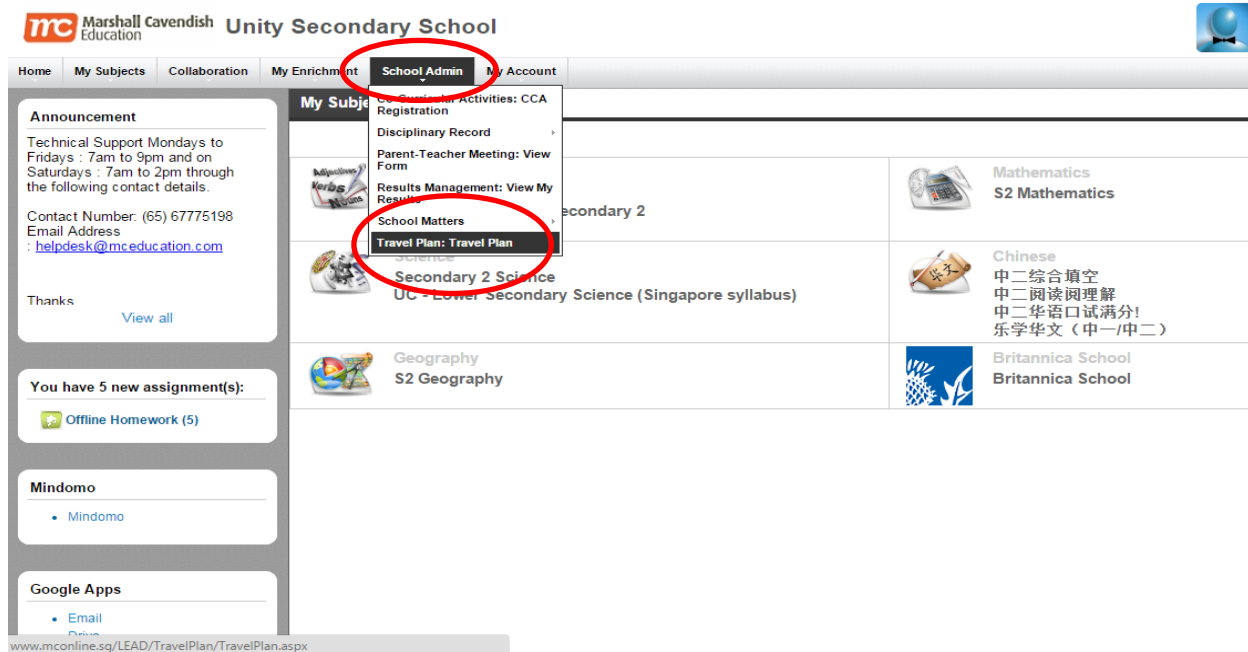
