

What are some of the things that I enjoy doing? How would I describe my strengths and interests?


- Align your strengths and interests with relevant courses offered by various educational institutions.
- For instance, if you have an interest in engineering, healthcare, or design, you might find suitable courses at institutions such as ITE.

- Taking into consideration the net aggregate points of the courses in 2025 JIE, list all the institutions that offer courses that you are interested in.
- For example, if you are interested in business, you can list down the business courses offered by the ITEs, such as Business Administration or Accounting.

Use the published Last Aggregate Score as a guide

- Do note that the new 3-year Higher Nitec courses may not have any Last Aggregate Scores.
- You will be counter-offered a course if you do not receive any of your 12 choices.
- Students in N(T) may also consider JIE-E Courses.



ITE Progression Award (IPA)



- On graduation from ITE, those who wish to pursue a diploma may be eligible for the IPA.
- Top-up of \$5000 to Post-Secondary Education Account upon enrolment in eligible diploma
- Top-up of \$10,000 to CPF Ordinary Account upon completion of diploma.

Can I appeal for transfer to another course?

- If you have received a course offer, consider accepting the offer first. After accepting the original offer, you may then submit an appeal for one alternative course.
- Keep your options open as accepting the current course offer ensures that you
 have a place at an ITE to continue your studies while waiting for the
 appeal results.
- While all eligible appeals for transfer will be given due consideration, meeting the minimum entry requirements does not guarantee a place in the course, as admission is also subject to available vacancies in open competition.

How do I appeal for a course?

- Submit your appeal via the ITE website: (https://www.ite.edu.sg). Please refer to the ITE website (www.ite.edu.sg) for the appeal dates.
- Click on the tab 'Apply for ITE Courses' and follow the steps on the website.

How do I check my JIE appeals outcome?

- Check the final result of your appeal at (https://istudent.ite.edu.sg) using the given web ID and password.
- Review your appeal outcome and carefully consider the course you are posted to.
- If you do not receive a posting by the end of JIE appeals, you will be offered an alternative course as an additional option.
- Consider accepting the alternative course, as it provides an opportunity to continue your studies.




What happens if my appeal is unsuccessful?

- If your initial appeal is unsuccessful, you may submit another appeal online during the final appeal phase. Please refer to the ITE website for details on the dates.
- To explore possible options please make an appointment with your ECG Counsellor.
