





CCA Home Group & Character Coaches

CCA Home Group (formerly known as Form Classes)

- Students are mixed according to CCAs (e.g. Upper Sec NPCC, Upper Sec Volleyball)
- Opportunities for students to interact with other students from different courses and different subjects
- Leadership opportunities for the senior students (by Sec 3, all students will be trained and given leadership positions to lead the juniors in the respective CCAs)

Character Coaches (formerly known as Form Teachers)

- CCA teachers (e.g. Sec 3 Track & Field Character Coach)
- To develop the character (e.g. weekly CCE lessons, CCA trainings)
- Smaller Teacher-Student Ratio (Closer monitoring of students' holistic development)
- Stay with students throughout their journey in Unity Sec (Stronger Teacher-Student Relationship)




Progression after Secondary 3

SEC 3EXP PROGRESSION






