Dear Parents,

Term 1 has been a vibrant start of the school year with our students and teachers engaged in many meaningful learning activities.

I am happy to see our **Sec 1 Unitians settling well into secondary school life** and embracing a new phase of holistic development in their growing-up years. 2.1 Mid-Year Examination (MYE) Time-tables

For Sec 4E/5N:

The MYE for English Language, Mother Tongue Languages and Social Studies for Sec 4E/5N will take place from Monday, 4 May 2015 to Wednesday, 6 May 2015. For the rest of the subjects, the MYE will take place in Term 3 from Monday, 29 June 2015 to Friday, 10 July 2015.

Students who do not have paper or programme for any of the examination days are not required to come to school.

Marking Day is on Monday, 18 May 2015. All students need not come to school on this day. Normal lessons will resume on Tuesday, 19 May 2015.

2.3 Social Scientist & Entrepreneurship Programme (SSEP)

The Social Scientist and Entrepreneurship Programme (SSEP) is a 2-year programme offered by the Humanities Department to develop students with an aptitude and passion for the Social Sciences. Students in SSEP can choose from a selection of modules, based on the domains of Social Studies, Geography and History. These modules aim to provide opportunities for the students to hone their research, presentation and critical thinking skills while exposing them to a broad range of issues in the Humanities. Modules can also include field trips and national competitions as part of the students' learning.

Last year, SSEP students participated in a variety of competitions including the National Pushcart Challenge organised by Republic Polytechnic and the Innovation Creativity Enterprise Challenge organised by MoneyTree Singapore. This year, new discipline-specific competitions such as the National Stamp Collecting Competition (History) and the Tourism in Action Challenge (Geography) will be offered.

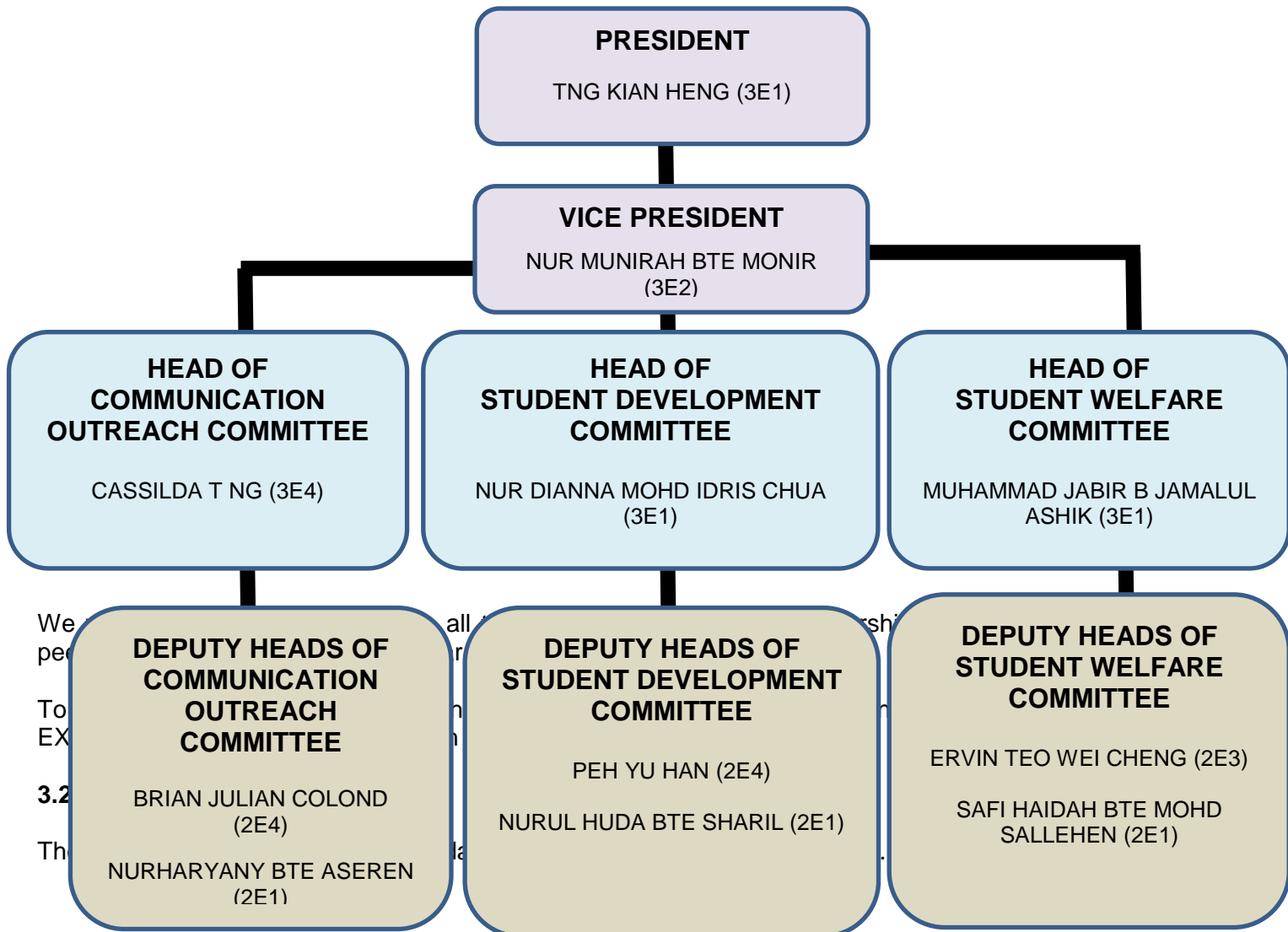

4.2 Holistic Health Education

Health Weight For Your Height Using Body Mass Index

Body Mass Index (BMI) is a measure used to determine whether you're at a healthy weight for your height. You can calculate your BMI using the formula below:

$$BMI = \frac{\text{Weight (kg)}}{\text{Height (m)} \times \text{Height (m)}}$$

Use the table below to determine which risk category you are at:

BMI (kg/m) for Adults above 18 years Old	Health Risk
27.5 and above	High Risk
23.0 - 27.4	Moderate Risk
18.5 - 22.9	Low Risk (Healthy Range)
Less than 18.5	Risk of nutritional deficiency diseases and osteoporosis

If your BMI is 23 kg/m² and above, you are at a higher risk of weight-related health problems such as Type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease, stroke, certain types of cancer and bone and joint disorders.

However, the BMI may not reliably predict health risks in pregnant women and people with muscular build.

How can you achieve a healthy BMI weight range?

If your BMI is 23 kg/m² and above, it is important that you lose some weight to reduce your risk of weight-related chronic diseases. There is no short-cut to reducing your BMI to the healthy range. To lose weight, you need to make sustainable changes to your eating and exercise habits.

Concept of energy balance

Our body uses energy/calories from food and these calories come from carbohydrates, protein and fat. When you consistently consume more calories than the amount you use for physical activity, you will tend to gain weight. There may be days where you will not be able to strike a balance between calorie intake and calorie output. This does not mean that you will put on weight immediately. It is the balance over time that determines whether you can maintain your weight in the long run. Hence understanding how to balance your energy is the key to managing your weight successfully.

So Remember...

1. A BMI of 23 kg/m² and above indicates that you are at risk of weight-related chronic diseases, and you should start to eat more healthily and increase your activity level to lose weight.
2. Strike a balance by being mindful of what you eat and how much you eat and by doing regular physical activity. This is the key to managing your weight successfully. You do not have to avoid social occasions.
3. Just keep the basic principles in mind; space out your intake of food, watch your portion sizes and go for healthier choices.
